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#### **BIG DONATIONS = BIG THANK YOU...**

Our long-standing members will be familiar with the New Hope Project. New Hope is a charity dedicated to repurposing unwanted stoma supplies for use in the Philippines where a single stoma bag can cost the equivalent of a day's wages. Many people cannot afford to buy them and so make do with home-made appliances using whatever they can find. For example, they will use plastic milk cartons as a base plate and a plastic bag as a stoma bag.

Since restarting in autumn 2021 we have shipped thousands of products to the Philippines (more than 200 full black bin liners). With NAMS providing storage space, and two of us using our garages capacity has grown... as have donations.

Everything is so gratefully received overseas, and really does make a difference. That said, please, only donate items that you can no longer use yourself and help us minimise wastage to the NHS.

As a general rule we have been receiving several boxes at a time and the cost of the items we receive from each person almost always runs into several hundred pounds, and in some cases over £1000.

The image here shows one carload collected, donated by two households, (non-IA members) worth over £2000.

Makes you think, doesn't it?!
